- 1) This is not a Blue Knight sanctioned ride, just a group of friends taking a ride together.
- 2) The route milage was based on information gleamed from Google Maps.
- 3) The stars attributed to any of the lodging selections, was obtained on Google Maps.
- 4) The cost per night at any of the lodging selection was obtained on Google, during the month of November 2025, it is unknown what the actual cost will be in July 2026. You are responsible for making your own reservation. I just included the name of the locations in the town, city, village, hamlet we are staying in for the night.
- 5) Your dining selection is up to you; there are several different choices at each location.
- 6) In Montana there were not too many choices, I tried my best to include what I could.
- 7) Each day we have to ride at minimum 450 Miles / 8 Hrs. Not including gas/lunch stops. We have a total of approximately 2200 Miles to cover in 5 days.

CARRYING A FIREARM ON A MOTORCYCLE

Hoping this article finds you all doing well and that everyone had a great New Year. While we start preparing for the upcoming riding season, there's a lot to consider. Preparing our schedules for events we're going to attend, making sure our bikes are up to date with inspection, oil changes, tires and so on. But while we consider our gear, do we think about how we carry our firearm? We are a Law Enforcement Motorcycle Club, so a large majority of

us conceal carry our firearms while riding.

First and foremost, make sure your HR218 and CCW permits are up to date - especially if you're riding through multiple states. That's something you should probably be doing anyway while carrying on your motorcycle. Once your permits are in order, there are a few things to consider. First, where on our body are you carrying it? Are you carrying your "get off me gun"? Or as some people, including myself, like to call it, the "oh sh*t gun"? Or are you carrying that full sized firearm? Second thought to consider, is it concealed? You want to avoid printing which is easier to do with some of the smaller firearms as opposed to full size firearms. Also, remember your motorcycle shakes and bit while you riding into the wind. You want your firearm secured, so its not falling out bouncing down the street.

Next we need to address your holster working with your carry position, whatever that looks like for you. Your holster needs to be of quality, close to the body and secured. If you have a leather pancake holster, you want it to have a strap going over the back of the slide keeping it in place with garments covering so the wind doesn't

show it off and the next stop light. If you don't have a strap to secure it, have a holster with a positive click the keeps it in place whether that's inside or outside the waistband. A method I recommend and have used, is carrying in a pocket holster. This protects the trigger from as accidental discharge and the magazine release from accidentally ejecting the magazine in your pocket. A pocket holster should be by itself with no keys, money or loose change, so while in the riding position, the pocket holster combined with the bend of your waist acts as extra security. As I'm sure most will agree, we're not going to be in that action movie scene where we are shooting while in motion. That would be tough to explain to a grand jury!

Two methods I absolutely do not recommend is carrying in your saddlebags (whether in a holster or not) or off body carry in a back pack or a cross body bag. Throwing all the God forbids at it, if a rider goes down, bags have a tendency to fly off your body and saddlebags shatter causing the firearm to fly down the road. If that should happen in a well populated area, your firearm would do as we affectionately call "The Bronx Bounce" - wouldn't hit the ground before someone picks it up and runs. I'd finally like to add an additional item we should already have in on board - a first aid kit. If you're carrying a tool to possibly take a life, you should also carry a tool to save a life - carry a tourniquet.

In closing. Again, I'd like to wish everyone a Happy New Year. Be good, be safe and as always, Ride With Pride.
