Our international convention in Calgary is less than a month away, we are scheduled to depart New York on Monday, July 13. Please anyone joining me in New York to start the five day ride to Montana. Please contact me so we can arrange a meeting location to start the ride West.

Those that may be joining me at any of the stopping overnight locations, please contact me so I know who to expect on each leg of the journey westbound.

Ride safe stay well and keep the Shining side up.

Here is the route from New York to Montana (Blue Knights International Conference). Before I post it, I just want to mention a few things:

- 1) This is not a Blue Knight sanctioned ride, just a group of friends taking a ride together.
- 2) The route milage was based on information gleamed from Google Maps.
- 3) The stars attributed to any of the lodging selections, was obtained on Google Maps.
- 4) The cost per night at any of the lodging selection was obtained on Google, during the month of November 2025, it is unknown what the actual cost will be in July 2026. You are responsible for making your own reservation. I just included the name of the locations in the town, city, village, hamlet we are staying in for the night.

5) Your dining selection is up to you; there are several different choices at each location.

6) In Montana there were not too many choices, I tried my best to include what I could.

7) Each day we have to ride at minimum 450 Miles / 8 Hrs. Not including gas/lunch stops. We have a total of approximately 2200 Miles to cover in 5 days.

I still have to plot the return trip from Montana to New York. It must likely, will be the same locations on the return trip.

I hope you are all doing well and finally enjoying some beautiful riding weather. I am glad to see so many of you posting your rides, Chapter events and other events you are attending/supporting.

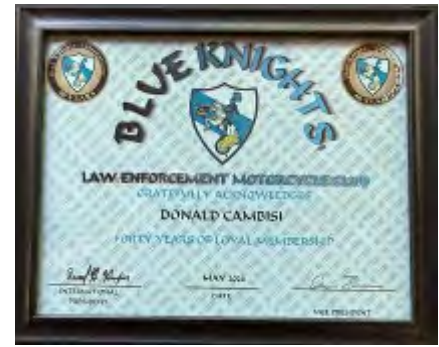

THE LONG RIDE AND THE FIRST AID KIT

Greetings to All,

Hope this finds you all doing well and you're getting a lot of riding in. Had a great time as always at Americade this year. Thanks to New York 22 for organizing the event. Also, a thank you to all who attended for the good times and The Georgian for their hospitality.

With the better weather comes longer rides, and I think a large majority of us carry some sort of tool kit in our saddlebags in the event our bikes have a mechanical issue. Just a small kit, with the essentials to get us back on the road and moving forward with the ride. So, our bike is covered. But what about us, the riders? Are we covered? How about a first aid kit. Maybe positioned in the saddlebag on the high side. Being in the high side bag makes for quicker deployment. Something that doesn't take much space and doesn't go overboard, but holds enough supplies to maybe save a life. Maybe even our own.

Let's start out with the pouch - small enough to not monopolize the whole saddlebag, but enough to carry the gear we may need. Red is a great color as it stands out in the saddlebag, especially at night while trying to grab it quickly. Placing a patch or writing our blood type on the bag is always a good idea. One of the main things to have in a first aid kit is a tourniquet to stem bleeding. I think most of us can speak to the importance of having one available, not only on the bike, but off the bike. A Sharpie or marker is also important so you can document when the tourniquet was applied. With the old adage that “two is one and one is none”, maybe have two tourniquets in your kit. A good option is the SWAT “T” or R.A.T.S (Rapid Application Tourniquet System). These are smaller and take up less space. But they do offer challenges to apply while alone. But nonetheless a viable back up. Next, we want to insure we have rubber gloves. I

would recommend two pairs. They do rip easily. I know what someone out there is saying. Why not have three pairs? Or four pairs? Yes, in the perfect world. But remember, we are trying to be compact. Next, we could include a compression bandage, commonly referred to as an 'Israeli bandage' along with Quick Clot (make sure it's not expired). Also, a sterile Triangular Bandage that can be used as a wrap or a sling, and a small roll of medical tape in case we need a little extra support. We also don't want to forget the smaller boo boo stuff. Some different size band aids, maybe some antiseptic wipes, burn cream and wound closure strips. Another important item are trauma shears to cut off any items of clothing understanding that if we apply a tourniquet, it's best applied to skin. Finally, something we may want to consider is an emergency blanket which can come in handy for many reasons. Funny story - I was riding back from the Outer Banks and it was colder than I expected. Unfortunately, I did not have my heated gear, so I cracked open the emergency spaceman blanket, wrapped it over my shoulders and around my torso, and put my leather jacket over it. I'll tell you after ten minutes, I was sweating like a hostage! So I would say, that alone is a good reason.

I hope you all found this article useful and encourages you to have a first aid kit, or perhaps update one you may already have. In closing I'll say, until the next time - be good and be safe. And, as always - Ride with Pride.
