I have finished compiling the route from New York to Montana. Before I post it, I just want to mention a few things:

1) This is not a Blue Knight sanctioned ride, just a group of friends taking a ride together.

2) The route milage was based on information gleamed from Google Maps.

3) The stars attributed to any of the lodging selections, was obtained on Google Maps.

4) The cost per night at any of the lodging selection was obtained on Google, during the month of November 2025, it is unknown what the actual cost will be in July 2026. You are responsible for making your own reservation. I just included the name of the locations in the town, city, village, hamlet we are staying in for the night.

5) Your dining selection is up to you; there are several different choices at each location.

6) In Montana there were not too many choices, I tried my best to include what I could.

7) Each day we have to ride at minimum 450 Miles / 8 Hrs. Not including gas/lunch stops. We have a total of approximately 2200 Miles to cover in 5 days.

SAFETY AND THE GUCCI GEAR ON OUR HANDLEBARS?



Hello everyone. I trust you are all having a great holiday season. Since it is the holidays and some of you may ask Santa for some new stuff for the upcoming riding season. I thought maybe this month we talk about all the Gucci gear we have dripping off our handlebars. And how some of this stuff affects us safety wise. One thing to remember is some of these things can get in the way. When we do one of those full lock turns. Do we smack our leg with the “Big Ass Cup Holder”? Do we find ourselves looking up and over our action camera to see the road? Having a GPS, cell phone or cameras mounted on our bikes can be a distraction at times. Let’s start off up top with the helmet. No matter what helmet you choose. No matter how much it cost. It has one job. Protecting your head. Ok, looking cool can be a secondary benefit. But safety is primary. You don’t want to compromise that with all sorts of gadgets stuck to your helmet. We may already have a communication system. Which for those long rides can be invaluable. But if you place a camera on your helmet. There are a few things you should make sure of before you go

kickstands up. With the camera in place. When you turn your head. Are your cameras smacking your shoulders? Is the position of your camera or gadget acting like a sail. Which can add to fatigue. Are the cameras partially blocking your view? Making you look like Red 5 using the force to make a final run at the Death Star. Some of these things you want to check before going kickstands up. You also want to make sure they're locked down according to specs.

Which leads us to the bike. You want to be sure for one. You can turn your handlebars all the way in either direction and not have them hit you. Second, All the gauges should be in view. If they weren't important. They wouldn't be in front of you. Third, you want to be able to get on and off your bike without trying your new yoga pose to avoid kicking anything. If you're mounting a camera. A good idea is avoid mounting your cameras and selfie sticks near wheels, chains or forks. You also want to avoid mounting it low to the road. Not only can this cause an accident for you. But your road chewed up camera can bounce up and hurt someone else. No matter what you're mounting. A GPS, Cell phone, action camera or that big ass cup holder. A good rule of thumb. Use the clamps, mounts and hardware made for the device you're using. Also, if available. Use a tether to secure your device to the bike. I can't tell people enough. Use quality. Try to avoid the cheap stuff we see in the Amazon and other places. They're some good quality, inexpensive items out there in the interwebs that can more than help.

Until the next time. I hope you find this article useful. Be good, be safe and always Ride with Pride. And to quote the author Clement Clarke Moore. "And away they all flew like the down of a thistle. But I heard him exclaim, as he drove out of sight- Happy Christmas to all, and to all a good night"
